The Backyard Farming Connection Watermelon Growing Guide

Need to Know: Watermelon grow on large vining plants and need a lot of space. Check the days to harvest before planting

Choose the Best Watermelon Varieties: Select the varieties based on size, color, seeds, and length to harvest.

	Sugar Baby: Compact, sweet, ideal for smaller gardens or containers.	Crimson Sweet: High sugar content, excellent flavor, popular among growers.	Charleston Gray: Sweet, firm flesh, resistant to pests and diseases.
Growing Requirements

Planting: Watermelons are typically planted after the last frost, favoring warm temperatures between 70°F and 80°F (21°C to 27°C).

Maintenance: Prevent overwatering, as watermelons prefer well-drained soil to avoid root rot.

Harvest: Watermelons are ready for harvest when fully ripe, typically 80-90 days after planting, varying by variety.

Companion Plants: marigolds and oregano. Avoid Planting with: potatoes, beans, or cucurbits.

Special Care: large watermelons can rot so place them on straw.
